Dear Northwestern Families, Staff, and Students,

I am very pleased to see the steady decline in COVID-19 cases in our communities. This downward trend is a contributing factor in moving forward with our plan to return all students to school for in-person learning. I have worked in collaboration with the Torrington Area Health District and the Farmington Valley Health District and they are in support of our decision to transition to our Full In-Person Learning Model. We anticipate implementing this learning model before the start of the fourth quarter.

Learning Model Survey: Next Monday, you will receive a survey asking you to identify the preferred learning model for your child when we return to full time, in-person learning. You will be asked to choose either the Full In-Person Learning Model or our Distance Learning Model. This data will help us determine how to address spacing issues in classrooms and in other settings throughout the school. We will remain vigilant with our suite of mitigation strategies and maintain the 6 ft social distancing protocol to the greatest extent possible. However, we will not be able to adhere to this standard in all settings.
