The 8 hour "Behind the Wheel" elective is comprised of four-hour sessions. Instruction

will include, but is not limited to entering traffic with smooth acceleration, centering in your land and maintain steady adherence to the posted speed limit, lane changing, right of way, parking maneuvers, highway driving, city driving, defensive driving techniques, road scanning,

Private Driving instruction. Connecticut Driving Students under the age of 18 are required

to have a minimum of 40 hours behind the wheel. Of course, the skill and comfort

that each student displays behind the wheel is often very different. For those

students who may require added instruction you have the option to request additional

private lessons. These lessons will be directed instructions of those skills that the

student would benefit from further instruction.

** Parent 2 hour class: The Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicles mandate that schools

of driver education provide a two hour class for parents/guardians in order to ...

"...educate parents/guardians about the graduated licensing law including passenger and curfew restrictions; the dangers of teenage driving, the risks inherent to allowing teenagers to drive due to the cognitive development of adolescents, and the responsibilities and liabilities of parents of teenage drivers. In addition, the class will include a discussion and provide tools

for parents/guardians to develop their own skills and behaviors to better prepare parents to model appropriate skills while instructing and driving with their teenagers. The goal of this class is to assist parent/guardians to coach and mentor their teenagers into safe and skilled drivers."

Objectives

- To explain what the Graduated Licensing Law is, why it was enacted, and learn the parent/guardian's role in supporting the law
- To obtain and review the list of driving skills that their child must master to pass a road test.
- To review the class module and their relevance to developing good driving skills.
- To discuss examples of driving behaviors to avoid because they may negatively influence a new driver.
- Understand and exhibit safe driving skills as a role model as they coach their Child to become a safe and skilled driver.

Course Overview

Northwestern R.S.D.#7 Driver Education program is established to fulfill the mission of the Connecticut D.M.V. in order to provide important knowledge and skills to assist the teen driver to develop safe driving habits. There are three modules the focusing on defining a responsible driver, controlling your vehicle, and driving in different environments. These modules will be presented during 30 hours of classroom time.

Students will also participate in 8 hours behind the wheel instruction. Students will practice the maneuvers, habits, and skills learned in class during "a minimum" of 32 hours of driving with their parents/guardians.

(30 hours of classroom instruction)

• Being a Responsible Driver

- o The Effects of Driver Condition/Physical and Mental Condition
- o Cognitive Development of Adolescents
- o Traffic Controls/Signs, Signals, and Roadway Markings.
- o Alcohol and Other Drugs.

- Controlling your Vehicle
 - o Knowing your vehicle
 - Natural Laws and Car Control
 - o Performing Basic Maneuvers
 - Negotiating Intersections
 - o Sharing the Roadways.
- Driving in Different Environments
 - o Driving in Urban Traffic

 - o Driving on Expressways
 - Driving in Adverse Conditions
 - Handling Emergencies

Behind the Wheel Instruction:

- Lesson 1: Basic skills involving steering, accelerating/braking, centering within their lane, entering a lane (within parking lot simulation),
- Lesson 2: On road/multi-lane driving, changing lanes, 3 point turns, u-turns, parallel parking, curb parking/pulling into traffic from a curb, parking on an incline both up and down hill, reverse driving, reverse parking, and introduction to highway driving, assessing safety zones, interpreting road signs, signals and markings.
- Lesson 3: Rural, suburban and urban settings, multi lane highway driving, parking maneuver practice, right of way at an intersection, entering intersections, entering and exiting a multilane highway, staggered merging on a multi-lane highway, assessing distance, identifying existing safety zones, interpreting road signs, signals, and road way markings. Parking practice.
- Lesson 4: Employing narrative driving. Practice of any skill that requires Review. Mock road test.

Disclosure: Every student's progress is based on their readiness to move-on to the next level. It is important that the student feels accomplished at a particular task before moving to more difficult experiences. Home practice is essential in helping the student to master learned skills and maneuvers. More importantly, regular, consistent practice sessions help a student develop self-confidence and mastery of important skills. There is no greater aspect of driving than having confidence with the knowledge that you are prepared.

Class policies:

- Students will attend 30 hours of classroom instruction.
 - ✓ If a class is missed the student may attend the same class when it is given during the following session to repeat that class.
 - ✓ A student will attend the full two hours of each class. The student is responsible for time missed due to being late or leaving early. More than 20 minutes will have to be made up during the next session.
 - ✓ Students will sign in, and be responsible for a lesson reflection log to exit the class.
 - ✓ When a class is being administered remotely. Students are expected to keep their cameras on during the class session.
 - ✓ Phones must be parked during class, as well as during the driving sessions.
 - ✓ Participation is a must.
- A Driving Schedule will be published on a Google Doc. Students will select from the online calendar four sessions during their respective seasonal program.
- If they are not able to keep that appointment as it interferes with work, school, or family obligations they will be responsible for both informing me (a minimum of 24 hours in advance) and selecting an open date and time to make up the appointment.
- Students will arrive on time. If a student is going to be late please call me at (860) 491-0331 to inform me of the fact and the estimated time of arrival. Appointments
 - are back to back so tardiness will impact students who are expecting to drive after you, so please be on time.
- When arriving at an appointment students will:
 - ✓ Temperature check.
 - ✓ Present learners permit.
 - ✓ Adjust, or apply seat, seat belt, and mirrors.
 - ✓ Apparel proper footwear, glasses, or contact lenses.
