Dear Northwestern Staff, Students, and Families:

COVID Update: We are excited to open school in a normal fashion. However, COVID remains a concern. We will continue to work collaboratively to prevent the spread of COVID in school. Please review the following health recommendations:

CDC Recommendations-

Anyone with symptoms of infectious disease, including influenza, and gastrointestinal infections should remain home. If experiencing <u>any</u> COVID symptoms you should get tested. If the test is negative and your symptoms persist, remain home.

DPH recommendations-

Students and staff with <u>mild</u> respiratory disease symptoms (infrequent cough, congestion, runny nose, sore throat etc.), and;

- <u>No fever</u> and no known COVID in the household in the past 2 weeks should test every day they have symptoms prior to leaving for school. If the test is negative and they feel well enough to report to school, they may attend. Mask wearing in school is strongly advised until symptoms resolve.
- Anyone with fever (>100F) or who feels feverish or lives with a person who recently tested positive for COVID within the past 2 weeks, should not report to

school. COVID testing is recommended. Once the fever has resolved for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication and the COVID test is negative they may return to school.

NWR7 will continue to report positive COVID cases to the DPH and post the information on our <u>website</u>. Please contact the school nurse regarding any questions or concerns regarding COVID.
